#### **CROP UPDATES**

California is expected to receive another round of rain mid-week, with more systems expected to pass to the north of Central California. As these systems pass, the southwestern desert region is bracing for another strong wind event, with sustained 25-35mph winds with gusts up to 40mph. This could damage crops like spinach, spring mix, and tender leaf items, increasing wind and fringe burn and dehydration. Read more

#### WEATHER

<u>Arizona</u> - Low pressure in southeast CA will bring light showers to Borrego Springs and central Arizona, with gusts of 22-28 mph in low deserts.

<u>California</u> - Light to moderate showers persist today, with additional 14" to 34" rain expected. Highs will cool, morning lows warm, and skies clear on Thursday night.

Florida -Today's showery weather in Northern Florida will end first, persisting into the evening in Southern Florida. Light isolated showers may occur on Thursday, followed by increased shower chances over the weekend.

<u>Mexico</u> - Warm temperatures through the weekend, ranging from 80s to 90s, with lows in the mid-40s to mid-50s, and expected dry weather over the next five days.

#### **FREIGHT**

Transit times are returning to acceptable levels as weather woes from weeks past subside. Truck availability and capacity is steady this week and will remain that way into next week. Yuma to Salinas transition is 6 weeks away!

### Weather Updates



#### **CALIFORNIA**

Light to moderate showers continue today, before tapering off early Thursday, bringing an additional 14" to 34" of rain to the region. Daytime highs will cool to the upper 50s to low 60s as morning lows warm to the mid 30s to upper 40s. The skies will clear Thursday night, but cloudiness associated with systems passing to the north will prevent temperatures from changing much over the weekend.



#### **MEXICO**

From today through the weekend, temperatures will be warm with little variation. Through Sunday, temperatures will range from the mid 80s to the low 90s. Over most locations, lows will drop into the mid-40s to mid-50s through Sunday. Over the next five days, the region should experience dry weather.



#### **FLORIDA**

We will continue to experience showery weather today. In Northern Florida, rain chances will end first, with rain chances persisting into the evening hours in Southern Florida. Trace amounts of additional rainfall may reach 0.15" in Northern Florida and 0.25 to 0.50" in Central and Southern Florida. There is a possibility of a few light isolated showers over Southern Florida on Thursday. Friday will be dry, then the chance of showers will increase over the weekend.



#### **ARIZONA**

In southeast CA late tonight, a weak area of low pressure will bring light scattered showers to Borrego Springs, then into central Arizona early Thursday through midday. There is a possibility of light rain in Yuma County around sunrise Thursday, but the chances are slim. There are gusts of 22-28 mph over the low deserts this evening, which will increase to 24-35 mph Thursday morning. The gusts will continue through Friday afternoon.

### Grop Updates

Mother Nature continues to impact supplies and quality out west with California expected to receive another round of rain mid-week. A couple more systems look to pass to the north of Central California into early next week. As these systems pass to the north the desert regions are bracing for another strong wind event. Sustained 25-35mph winds with gusts up to 40mph are expected across the southwestern desert region into Friday.

These crops have already been battered by previous freezes, heat waves, hail and rains in the region. Strong winds can then do extensive damage to these already weakened crops, especially spinach, spring mix and tender leaf items. The leaves of the various crops can be left tattered and torn allowing an entrance for pathogens to take hold. This will only increase wind and fringe burn, as well as deposit some dust on the crops. The winds will also likely increase dehydration in the leafy green crops once again impacting the texture and shelf life of most crops.

Warm temperatures and humidity in the desert regions will quickly increase insect populations across the region. Aphids, flies and other critters are already becoming noticeable in many upcoming fields. As growers combat the bugs with insecticide sprays the small gnats and flies tend to hide and accumulate in between the leaves as they die off making them very difficult to find and remove during harvests. The warm temperatures will also increase heat related defects including weak tip internal burn, twist/irregular shape, seeders, causing dehydrated/weaker texture and lesser overall shelf life. Mildews and disease pressure are also taking a toll on current production of iceberg and romaine with some fields being left behind due to poor quality. These supplies will continue to show some premature pinking along the rib that is not seen during harvest and tends to show up during transit and storage.

On the processing side the overall growing conditions, causing leaf sensitivity andweaker overall texture can result in increased mechanical damage and bruising during harvest and processing. Processed leafy green items will also likely see an increase in discoloration and breakdown showing up in the bag affecting shelf life. The spring mix and tender leaf items will continue to show some yellowing, discoloration and breakdown along with weaker texture and lesser shelf life due to the growing conditions in the region.

It remains very important to keep your rotations in check as the overall quality and shelf life of most crops, especially processed items, will be challenged. We will keep an eye on the upcoming weather and the impact on the various crops to keep you up to date as we gather more information.
